Mary Margaret Hammond, Chair, Glass Ceiling Task Force, and Commissioner, Commission for Women, presented the findings and recommendations of the Glass Ceiling Task Force in a report entitled *Breaking Barriers: Women's Advancement in Fairfax County Government*.

Following discussion, with input from Ms. Hammond, Supervisor Mendelsohn asked unanimous consent that the Board direct staff to provide the percentages of women in high grade levels over a number of years to determine the trend. Without objection, it was so ordered.

Following further discussion, Supervisor Gross asked unanimous consent that the Board direct staff to provide the new members of the Board with the 1994 Task Force Report on *Minority Upward Mobility and Retention in Fairfax County Government*. Without objection, it was so ordered.

Following further discussion, with input from David P. Bobzien, County Attorney, Chairman Hanley relinquished the Chair to Vice-Chairman Hyland and moved that the Board:

- Accept and endorse the Report, particularly Item One of the recommendations, "That the Board of Supervisors reaffirm its commitment to the development and advancement of women at all levels within County Government"; and

Vice-Chairman Hyland returned the gavel to Chairman Hanley.

A-5 - APPROVAL TO ESTABLISH TWO HOUSING SERVICES SPECIALIST I TO ADMINISTER SECTION EIGHT CERTIFICATES POSITIONS OR VOUCHERS FOR UNASSISTED LOW **INCOME** RESIDENTS OF PRESERVATION ELIGIBLE PROJECTS APPROVED FOR PREPAYMENT OF STATES DEPARTMENT UNITED (US)OF HOUSING AND URBAN (HUD) DEVELOPMENT ASSISTED **MORTGAGES** (DRANESVILLE, **PROVIDENCE AND HUNTER MILL DISTRICTS**) (Tape 4)

Supervisor Connolly moved that the Board concur in the recommendation of staff and approve the establishment of two Housing Services Specialist I positions in the Department of Housing and Community Development (HCD) to administer additional Section Eight Certificates for approximately 252-292 families facing increased rent burdens as a result of owner action to prepay United States (US) Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) insured mortgages. This motion was seconded by Supervisor Bulova.

Following discussion, with input from Anthony H. Griffin, Acting County Executive; Verdia L. Haywood, Deputy County Executive for Human Services; and Walter D. Webdale, Director, HCD, Supervisor Mendelsohn asked to amend the motion to approve the establishment of the two Housing Services Specialist I positions as "grant funded" positions, and this was accepted.

Following further discussion, with additional input from Mr. Webdale, Supervisor Connolly asked unanimous consent that the Board direct staff to provide a Countywide breakdown of the Section Eight allocations by District. Without objection, it was so ordered.

The question was called on the motion, as amended, which carried by unanimous vote.

Supervisor Kauffman moved that the Board concur in the recommendation of staff and authorize the reallocation of \$166,000 from Housing Trust Funds to the Tavenner Lane Development for:

- An increase for Whitener and Jackson, Incorporated, for construction of the Tavenner Lane Apartments;
- Funds for completion of bond release site work which was not completed by Aztec Construction Company; and
- Legal expenses incurred by the Tavenner Lane Partnership.

This motion was seconded by Supervisor Hyland.

Following discussion, with input from David P. Bobzien, County Attorney, and Walter D. Webdale, Director, Department of Housing and Community Development (HCD), Chairman Hanley announced that Action Item <u>A-6 - Authorization to Reallocate Housing</u> <u>Trust Funds for the Tavenner Lane Development (Lee District)</u> would be deferred until after Executive Session.

(NOTE: Later in the meeting, action was taken on this item. See Clerk's Summary Item CL#55.)

THE 19. A-7 AUTHORIZATION TO AWARD \$50,000 FROM -PREDEVELOPMENT FUND TO THE FAIRFAX COUNTY REDEVELOPMENT AND AUTHORITY (FCRHA) THE **PURPOSES** HOUSING FOR OF CONDUCTING PRELIMINARY STUDIES RELATING TO THE ISLAND WALK COOPERATIVE (HUNTER MILL DISTRICT) (Tape 4)

Supervisor Dix moved that the Board concur in the recommendation of staff and authorize the award of \$50,000 from the Predevelopment Fund (Subfund 182, Housing Trust Fund) to the Fairfax County Redevelopment and Housing Authority (FCRHA) for the purposes of conducting an evaluation of needed physical improvements and feasibility of program restructuring of the Island Walk Cooperative. This motion was seconded by Supervisor Mendelsohn.

Following discussion, with input from Walter D. Webdale, Director, Department of Housing and Community Development (HCD), the question was called on the motion which carried by a vote of eight, Supervisor Connolly and Supervisor Frey being out of the room.

20. <u>A-8 - BOARD ACTION ON APPLICATIONS FROM VARIOUS COMPANIES</u> <u>FOR CERTIFICATES TO OPERATE TAXICABS IN FAIRFAX COUNTY</u> (Tapes 4-5)

Supervisor Bulova moved that the Board concur in the recommendation of staff and:

- Award a total of 10 certificates to operate taxicabs in Fairfax County, distributed as follows:
 - Murphy Brothers, Incorporated two certificates;
 - Fairfax Taxi, Incorporated two certificates;
 - Paul Wallace Management, Incorporated three certificates;
 - L and Z Transportation, Incorporated three certificates; and
- Deny the application of Fairfax Taxi Service.

This motion was seconded by Supervisor Kauffman.

Following discussion, with input from Anthony H. Griffin, Acting County Executive; Ronald B. Mallard, Director, Department of Consumer Affairs; Carolyn A. Quetsch, Department of Consumer Affairs; and David Bulova, Chairman, Consumer Protection Commission, Supervisor Dix moved a substitute motion that the Board award the following certificates to operate taxicabs in Fairfax County:

- Murphy Brothers, Incorporated five certificates;
- Fairfax Taxi, Incorporated five certificates;
- Paul Wallace Management, Incorporated five certificates;
- L and Z Transportation, Incorporated five certificates; and
- Fairfax Taxi Service 10 certificates.

This motion was seconded by Supervisor McConnell and <u>FAILED</u> by a recorded vote of six, Supervisor Dix, Supervisor Frey, Supervisor McConnell, and Supervisor Mendelsohn voting "AYE."

Supervisor Mendelsohn moved to amend the main motion to grant three certificates to operate taxicabs to Fairfax Taxi Service. This motion was seconded by Supervisor Dix and **<u>FAILED</u>** by a recorded vote of five, Supervisor Dix, Supervisor Frey, Supervisor Hyland, Supervisor McConnell, and Supervisor Mendelsohn voting "**AYE**."

The question was then called on the main motion (the staff recommendation) which <u>CARRIED</u> by a recorded vote of seven, Supervisor Dix, Supervisor McConnell, and Supervisor Mendelsohn voting "NAY."

21. <u>I-1 - PORTABILITY OF PENSION BENEFITS WITHIN THE</u> <u>COMMONWEALTH OF VIRGINIA</u> (Tape 5)

The Board next considered an item contained in the Memorandum to the Board dated July 7, 1997 requesting authorization for staff to enter into negotiations with any interested and eligible retirement system within the Commonwealth of Virginia in order to grant retirement portability.

The staff was directed administratively to proceed as proposed.

The Board next considered an item contained in the Memorandum to the Board dated July 7, 1997 requesting authorization for staff to award a contract in the amount of \$269,973 to Brothers Construction Company, Incorporated for roof repairs and related work at the Oak Marr and South Run Recreation Centers as part of Project 004748, General Park Improvements, in Subfund 950, Park Authority Capital Improvement Trust Fund.

The staff was directed administratively to proceed as proposed.

24. <u>I-4 - AWARD OF CONTRACT FOR EQUIPMENT MASTER</u> <u>LEASE-PURCHASE AGREEMENT</u> (Tape 5)

The Board next considered an item contained in the Memorandum to the Board dated July 7, 1997 requesting authorization for staff to award a contract for the Master Lease Agreement to Carlyle Capital Markets, Incorporated.

The staff was directed administratively to proceed as proposed.

25. <u>I-5 - PLANNING COMMISSION ACTION ON APPLICATION 456-D97-2, BELL</u> <u>ATLANTIC CORPORATION, FORMERLY KNOWN AS CHESAPEAKE AND</u> <u>POTOMAC TELEPHONE COMPANY OF VIRGINIA (DRANESVILLE</u> <u>DISTRICT)</u> (Tape 5)

The Board next considered an item contained in the Memorandum to the Board dated July 7, 1997 presenting the Planning Commission action to approve Public Facilities Application 456-D97-2.

The staff was directed administratively to proceed as proposed.

26. <u>I-6 - CONTRACT AWARD - CURBSIDE RECYCLING SERVICE IN FAIRFAX</u> <u>COUNTY'S SANITARY DISTRICTS (BRADDOCK, DRANESVILLE, HUNTER</u> <u>MILL, LEE, MASON, MOUNT VERNON, AND PROVIDENCE DISTRICTS)</u> (Tape 5)

The Board next considered an item contained in the Memorandum to the Board dated July 7, 1997 requesting authorization for staff to award a contract to The Recycling Center at \$2.23 per unit per month or \$1,020,974 per year for curbside recycling services.

Following discussion, with input from Richard J. Gozikowski, Acting Director, Department of Public Works (DPW); Jerry Hubbard, Director, Solid Waste Collection and Recycling Division, DPW; and Larry N. Wellman, Director, Purchasing and Supply Management Agency, Chairman Hanley announced that consideration of this item would be deferred until later in the meeting pending further clarification from staff.

(NOTE: Later in the meeting, action was taken on this item. See Clerk's Summary Item CL#72.)

ADDITIONAL BOARD MATTERS

27. **FAIRFAX COUNTY ECONOMIC INDEX** (Tape 5)

Chairman Hanley called attention to the report on the Fairfax County Economic Index which has been distributed to Board Members.

28. NATIONAL ASSOCIATION OF COUNTIES (NACo) AWARDS (Tape 5)

Chairman Hanley relinquished the Chair to Vice-Chairman Hyland and asked unanimous consent that the Board direct staff to prepare an Information Item, for consideration by the Board, highlighting the achievement awards received from the National Association of Counties (NACo) for the County programs entitled "Budget Decision Model" and "Return on Investment - Creative Contracting." Without objection, it was so ordered.

Vice-Chairman Hyland returned the gavel to Chairman Hanley.

29. NATIONAL ASSOCIATION OF COUNTIES (NACo) CANDIDATE - MOUNT

VERNON DISTRICT SUPERVISOR GERALD "GERRY" W. HYLAND (Tapes 5-6)

Chairman Hanley referred to Mount Vernon District Supervisor Gerald "Gerry" W. Hyland's candidacy for the office of First Vice-President of the National Association of Counties (NACo) at its Conference scheduled for July 13, 14, and 15, 1997 in Baltimore.

Supervisor Hyland invited Board Members and all County employees to join in the lobbying efforts on behalf of his campaign at the Convention Center in the Inner Harbor of Baltimore.

30. <u>APPOINTMENT TO THE TREE COMMISSION</u> (Tape 6)

(APPT)

Supervisor Dix moved the appointment of <u>Ms. Catherine Martin</u> to fill the unexpired term of Mr. William R. Hoppe as the Hunter Mill District Representative to the Tree Commission. This motion was seconded by Supervisor Kauffman and carried by unanimous vote.

31. <u>TOWN CENTER TOWER, LLC -- DEVELOPMENT PLAN AMENDMENT</u> <u>APPLICATION DPA 85-C-088-2</u> (Tape 6)

Supervisor Dix stated that Town Center Tower, LLC, has submitted Development Plan Amendment Application DPA 85-C-088-2 requesting to amend a portion of the DPA for Section 85 located in the Reston Town Center District to allow a residential building height up to 14 stories. The current Plan calls for residential uses up to 10 stories on this site.

With a notation that the public hearing before the Planning Commission is scheduled for July 30, 1997, Supervisor Dix moved that the Board direct staff to schedule a public hearing to be held before the Board on <u>August 4, 1997 at 4:30 p.m.</u> This motion was seconded by Supervisor Mendelsohn and carried by unanimous vote.

32. <u>CONCURRENT PROCESSING OF THE PRELIMINARY AND FINAL SITE</u> <u>AND PUBLIC IMPROVEMENT PLANS FOR PHASE II, RESTON TOWN</u> <u>CENTER</u> (Tape 6)

Supervisor Dix noted that Westerra Reston, along with Boston Properties, is ready to begin development of Phase II of Reston Town Center due to a prospective major tenant leasing approximately 415,000 square feet of office and retail space in a proposed 18 story office building with an associated parking structure. Separate Site Plans and Public Improvement Plans will be submitted for this project, to include the office building, parking structure, and extensions of Market Street, Freedom Drive, and Explorer Street. A modified processing request has been submitted to DEM for this major development project.

Accordingly, Supervisor Dix moved that the Board authorize the Acting Director of the Department of Environmental Management (DEM) to concurrently process the

preliminary and final Site and Public Improvement Plans for Phase II of Reston Town Center. This motion was seconded by Supervisor McConnell and carried by unanimous vote.

33. <u>REQUEST FOR CONCURRENT PROCESSING OF THE SITE PLAN FOR</u> <u>TEMPLE RODEF SHALOM</u> (Tape 7)

Supervisor Mendelsohn moved that the Board direct the Acting Director of the Department of Environmental Management (DEM) to concurrently process the Site Plan for Temple Rodef Shalom during the processing of Rezoning Application RZ-1997-D-028 and Special Exception Application SE 97-D-038 for property located on Tax Map Reference 40-2-1-19. This motion does not relieve the applicant from complying with provisions of all applicable conditions, regulations or adopted standards relative to this Site Plan nor does it in any way anticipate support for the rezoning and special exception applications which will be considered at a later date by the Board. This motion, the second to which was indistinguishable, carried by a vote of nine, Supervisor Dix being out of the room.

34. <u>APPOINTMENT TO THE ATHLETIC COUNCIL</u> (Tape 7)

(APPT)

Supervisor Connolly moved the appointment of <u>Mr. R. Lin Lemon, Jr.</u> as Providence District (Alternate) Representative to the Athletic Council. This motion was seconded by Supervisor Bulova and carried by a vote of nine, Supervisor Dix being out of the room.

35. <u>REQUEST FOR CONCURRENT PROCESSING OF THE SITE PLAN IN</u> <u>CONJUNCTION WITH THE SPECIAL PERMIT AMENDMENT</u> <u>APPLICATION FOR SAINT ANDREW LUTHERAN CHURCH</u> (Tape 7)

Supervisor Frey stated that Saint Andrew Lutheran Church has filed a Special Permit Amendment Application to allow an addition to their current Fellowship Hall located at 14640 Soucy Place, Tax Map Reference 54-1((6))parcel 1A. To assist the Church in a timely completion of this much-needed expansion, Supervisor Frey moved that the Board:

- Authorize concurrent processing of the Site Plan in conjunction with Special Permit Amendment Application SPA 79-S-351-4. It is understood that this motion does not assure approval of the Special Permit Amendment, and the Church is responsible for any changes that might occur as a result of the Special Permit Amendment public hearing; and
- Direct the Acting Director of the Department of Environmental Management (DEM) to favorably consider Street Light Waiver Number 014261 filed on behalf of Saint Andrew Lutheran Church.

This motion was seconded by Supervisor Bulova and carried by a vote of eight, Supervisor Dix and Supervisor Mendelsohn being out of the room.

36. <u>REQUEST TO INCLUDE AVERY ROAD RIGHT-OF-WAY IN THE PROPOSED</u> <u>REZONING APPLICATION FILED BY TOLL BROTHERS</u> (Tape 7)

Supervisor Frey stated that Toll Brothers has filed a Rezoning Application along West Ox Road and he moved that the Board approve allowing the existing Avery Road (Route 754) right-of-way to be included in the proposed Rezoning Application. This motion was seconded by Supervisor Hyland and carried by a vote of eight, Supervisor Dix and Supervisor Mendelsohn being out of the room.

37. <u>CONSIDERATION ITEM TO BE INCLUDED IN THE CARRYOVER BUDGET</u> <u>REGARDING THE ARCHITECTURAL REVIEW BOARD (ARB)</u> (Tape 7)

In an effort to continue supporting the preservation of historic places and the quality of life in Fairfax County, Supervisor Frey moved that the Board authorize \$2800 to be put into the Carryover Budget as a Consideration Item to fund the Architectural Review Board's (ARB) minute keeping and CLG-required training. This motion was seconded by Supervisor Bulova and carried by a vote of eight, Supervisor Dix and Supervisor Mendelsohn being out of the room.

38. <u>SUCCESSFUL FOURTH OF JULY CELEBRATIONS IN FAIRFAX COUNTY</u> (Tape 7)

Supervisor Frey expressed his appreciation to the Police Department for its help in making Fourth of July celebrations in Fairfax County successful.

39. INTENT TO DEFER THE PUBLIC HEARING ON PROFFERED CONDITION <u>AMENDMENT APPLICATION PCA 86-L-077 (POTTERS GLEN COMMUNITY</u> <u>ASSOCIATION, INCORPORATED) (LEE DISTRICT)</u> (Tape 7)

Supervisor Kauffman announced his intent, later in the meeting at the appropriate time, to defer the public hearing on Proffered Condition Amendment Application PCA 86-L-077 until July 21, 1997 at 4:30 p.m.

(NOTE: Later in the meeting, the public hearing was formally deferred. See Clerk's Summary Item CL#60.)

40. <u>OPENING OF THE NEW FRANCONIA-SPRINGFIELD METRO STATION AT</u> <u>THE JOE ALEXANDER TRANSPORTATION CENTER</u> (Tape 7)

Supervisor Kauffman announced the opening on Sunday, June 29, 1997, of the new Franconia-Springfield Metro Station at the Joe Alexander Transportation Center. He expressed his appreciation to the Greater Springfield Chamber of Commerce, Theresa Bachus of Springfield Mall, and all the other businesses and individuals that made the opening ceremony a great success.

41. EXPANSION OF THE ROBINSON RESIDENTIAL PERMIT PARKING DISTRICT (RPPD): WAIVER OF THE MINIMUM CONTIGUOUS PARKING SPACES (Tape 8)

Supervisor Bulova stated that she has forwarded the petition for the expansion of the Robinson Residential Permit Parking District (RPPD) on Holden Street from Sideburn Road to Concordia Street to the Office of Transportation (OT). On May 19, 1997 the Board approved the waiver of the fees. To proceed with the request, OT needs Board approval to waive the minimum 100 contiguous on-street parking spaces.

Accordingly, Supervisor Bulova moved that the Board direct staff to waive the parking space requirement and to proceed as expeditiously as possible. This motion was seconded by Supervisor McConnell and carried by a vote of nine, Supervisor Dix being out of the room.

42. <u>SCHEDULING OF PUBLIC HEARING FOR REZONING APPLICATION</u> <u>RZ 1997-BR-017</u> (Tape 8)

Supervisor Bulova stated that Batal Builders has filed a rezoning application in the Braddock District for approximately 10 acres off Ox Road. She noted that this rather large rezoning (for the Braddock District) has a sensitive transportation issue that is taking some time to resolve and which will affect the layout of the plan. However, all other issues are being addressed.

To achieve flexibility with the Planning Commission public hearing date, yet ensure a timely public hearing before the Board, Supervisor Bulova moved that the Board direct staff to schedule a public hearing to be held before the Board for Rezoning Application RZ 1997-BR-017 on <u>October 27, 1997 at 3:30 p.m.</u> This motion, the second to which was indistinguishable, carried by a vote of nine, Supervisor Dix being out of the room.

43. JOINT BOARD MATTER PRESENTED BY SUPERVISORS BULOVA AND MCCONNELL REGARDING THE PROPOSED FAIRFAX STATION POST OFFICE (Tape 8)

Noting that she was presenting this item jointly on behalf of herself and Supervisor McConnell, Supervisor Bulova stated that the National Capital Planning Commission (NCPC) is requesting that the County review and comment on a proposal to locate a new postal facility in the Braddock District on the south side of the Fairfax County Parkway, east of Ox Road, on a remnant parcel created by the construction of the Parkway.

Supervisor Bulova explained that the proposed location, while adjacent to the Parkway, has no direct access to either the Parkway or Ox Road. Access would be via Little Ox Road which has poor sight distance where it intersects with Ox Road. Little Ox Road is a cul-de-sac that currently serves as the access street for the Hunt at Fairfax Station, a new subdivision of large lots zoned R-1 close to land in the Occoquan.

Supervisor Bulova added that the proposed postal facility site was created when the

Parkway was built and bisected an existing parcel located next to the Virginia Concrete plant. This southern portion of Lot 9 is zoned I-5, but given its orientation south of the Parkway, its lack of accessibility, and its proximity to low density residential development, an industrial or high intensity public use would not be compatible or in character with the adjacent residential use. In fact, during the 1994 Area Plan Review exercise, the Braddock District Task Force submitted a Plan nomination to "down plan" this parcel to a low density residential use in character with the Hunt at Fairfax Station, which was then under construction. At that time the owner, Virginia Power, objected to the amendment so the Task Force withdrew it.

Noting that there is no question that the Postal Service needs a new facility in that area, Supervisor Bulova stated that both she and Supervisor McConnell are sympathetic to the problem and have offered assistance in finding a suitable location, which this one is not. Both the Braddock and Springfield Districts' Planning Commissioners, as well as staff from the Office of Comprehensive Planning (OCP), concur in this assessment.

Accordingly, Supervisor Bulova, jointly with Supervisor McConnell, moved that the Board direct staff to notify the NCPC that this proposed location for a postal facility is unacceptable for the reasons previously outlined. This motion was seconded by Supervisor McConnell and carried by unanimous vote.

44. **<u>REQUEST FOR WAIVER OF FEES FOR SHOWMOBILE</u>** (Tape 8)

With reference to his written Board Matters, as distributed to the Board, Supervisor Hyland noted that his first item requests consideration of waiving a \$150 fee for the Showmobile in connection with the celebration of the Sherwood Regional Library's 25th Anniversary.

Accordingly, Supervisor Hyland moved that the \$150 fee associated with the use of the Showmobile be waived by the Board assuming it meets with the concurrence of the County Attorney's opinion. This motion was seconded by Supervisor McConnell and carried by unanimous vote.

45. <u>1997 FORT HUNT CONCERT SERIES</u> (Tape 8)

Supervisor Hyland announced that the 1997 Fort Hunt Concert Series presented by the National Park Service has begun its series of Sunday evening concerts at Fort Hunt Park just off the Mount Vernon Parkway. He distributed concert schedules to the Board.

46. **<u>REQUEST CREATION OF PORNO PANEL IN FAIRFAX COUNTY</u>** (Tape 8)

With reference to his written Board Matter on the subject on pornography, Supervisor Hyland suggested that the County consider the creation of a "Porno Panel" of citizens similar to what has been assembled in Prince William County to judge whether the contents of videos sold in County stores are too obscene to be legal. He cited a newspaper article about the panel in Prince William County.

Accordingly, Supervisor Hyland moved that the Board refer this matter to the County Attorney for review with the Commonwealth's Attorney to determine if Fairfax County can assemble its own citizen panel to ascertain whether the contents of videos rented or sold in the County conform with general community decency standards. This motion was seconded by Supervisor Kauffman.

Following discussion, with input from David P. Bobzien, County Attorney, Supervisor Hyland amended the motion to direct the County Attorney to review this issue and respond as to what action has already been undertaken, and this was accepted.

The question was called on the motion, as amended, which carried by unanimous vote.

47. **<u>FUNDING FOR FREEDOM HOUSE</u>** (Tape 8)

Supervisor Hyland stated that the Northern Virginia Urban League (NOVAUL) Board has as their goal to raise \$1 million by August 31, 1997 to purchase Freedom House, a national and state historic landmark located in the City of Alexandria. The significance of Freedom House is that from 1828-1836 it was one of the largest slave trading companies in the country with 3,750 slaves purchased, traded, sold, and transported from Virginia to the deep south.

Supervisor Hyland added that in 1996, NOVAUL relocated its offices to Freedom House, 1315 Duke Street, and has plans to make it both a center for cultural education and a permanent location for the fulfillment of its mission to advocate for and provide program services to African-Americans and other disadvantaged persons. The basement "slave pen" will become a museum, preserving the vestiges of the past for the purpose of exploring history, and providing lessons in genealogy, educating children and adults of all ethnic backgrounds about their cultural heritage through classes, drama, and storytelling. Public tours will also be available.

Supervisor Hyland stated that NOVAUL is seeking some financial assistance with this project. He noted that the City of Alexandria recently committed to making a \$25,000 one-time donation to purchase Freedom House.

Accordingly, Supervisor Hyland moved that the Board:

- Authorize this as a Consideration Item for a one-time contribution to the Northern Virginia Urban League for the Freedom House acquisition in an amount to be determined after review and recommendation of staff; and
- Direct the Office of Public Affairs to disseminate information to the public concerning this worthwhile project.

This motion was seconded by Supervisor Frey and carried by unanimous vote.

48. **<u>PINE RIDGE PARK SITE</u>** (Tape 8)

Noting that this Board Matter is a joint proposal with Supervisor Connolly, Supervisor Gross stated that the School Board owns approximately 42 acres of property located at

3401 Woodburn Road, also known as the Pine Ridge Park site. This property was acquired for school purposes in the 1960's, but a school was never built. Since the early 1980's, the property has been administered under a lease agreement by the Park Authority and developed with ball fields and garden plots. The surrounding community would like to see the property become a permanent park. The School Board retains ownership of the property.

In an effort to achieve the community's goals, Supervisor Gross moved that the Board direct County staff and the staffs of the School Board and the Park Authority to work together to resolve the future of the Pine Ridge Park site, and consider any and all means, including, but not limited to, purchase and land exchange. This motion was seconded by Supervisor Connolly.

Supervisor Dix asked to amend the motion to change the wording of the motion to **request**, rather than direct, the staff of the School Board and Park Authority to work together, and this was accepted.

(NOTE: On June 23, 1997, the Board held a public hearing on the proposed amendments to the Code of the County of Fairfax, Chapter 6 (Weapons), and deferred its decision until July 7, 1997.)

Following a lengthy discussion, with input from M. Douglas Scott, Chief of Police, and Michael H. Long, Assistant County Attorney, Supervisor Bulova moved adoption of the proposed amendments to the Code of the County of Fairfax, Chapter 6 (Weapons) regarding a requirement for applicants for permits to carry concealed handguns to be fingerprinted. This motion was seconded by Supervisor Kauffman and <u>FAILED</u> by a recorded vote of five, Supervisor Dix, Supervisor Frey, Supervisor Hyland, Supervisor McConnell, and Supervisor Mendelsohn voting "NAY," Supervisor Bulova, Supervisor Connolly, Supervisor Gross, Supervisor Kauffman, and Chairman Hanley voting "AYE."

72. <u>I-6 - CONTRACT AWARD - CURBSIDE RECYCLING SERVICE IN FAIRFAX</u> <u>COUNTY'S SANITARY DISTRICTS (BRADDOCK, DRANESVILLE, HUNTER</u> <u>MILL, LEE, MASON, MOUNT VERNON, AND PROVIDENCE DISTRICTS)</u> (Tape 11)

The Board next considered an item contained in the Memorandum to the Board dated July 7, 1997 requesting authorization for staff to award a contract to The Recycling Center at \$2.23 per unit per month or \$1,020,974 per year for curbside recycling services.

Following discussion, with input from Anthony H. Griffin, Acting County Executive, staff was directed administratively to proceed as proposed.
