1. Taxicab Regulation: An Industry Overview. Steve Sinclair, Chief, Public Utilities Branch presented an overview of the taxicab industry and provided information on price regulation, price deregulation, history of price regulation in Fairfax County, taxicab fare rent increases, industry price index, determination of certificates, control of entry issues, taxicab industry characteristics, promises vs. reality, unregulated market entry, Board approved formula, industry economics, industry feedback, and the certificate formula approach.

A discussion ensued on the rationale that consumers benefit from the regulation of taxicabs, market entry issue and whether it would be easier if more players were allowed, number of allotted certificates, use of the formula, etiquette training for drivers, customer survey, providing studies used by staff, and whether back-up data will be provided once the final calculations are complete.
