
October 2018

Ensuring Affordable Produce in Fairfax County

Due to a grant of \$50,000 over three years, Fairfax County Farmers Markets will ensure SNAP (previously called food stamps) recipients can access fresh local produce. At participating farmers markets, the value of SNAP dollars is doubled by the Virginia Fresh Match nutrition incentive program – for example, if a person spends \$20 in SNAP benefits at a farmers market, they

will receive \$20 more to spend on fruits and vegetables. Read more...

Meet one of Mount Vernon's Architectural Review Board (ARB) Members, Michele Aubry. Michele told us that serving on the ARB is a great way to give back to the local community while using her professional training gained in a career with the National Park Service (NPS). When asked why she chose to serve on the ARB, Michele responded, "To be honest, I had never heard of the ARB until an NPS colleague asked if I would be interested in filling the vacant Archaeologist slot. He explained what was involved and, at his suggestion, I talked to

the person who had just vacated the position after many years of service. I liked what I heard, submitted my resume, and joined the ARB the month before my retirement from the NPS."

Michele explained that the **ARB hears proposals** from people who want to make certain changes to their property within an **Historic Overlay District**. She added that she particularly enjoys the moments when projects are designed in a manner that preserves the historic nature of the property and enhances the historic district. Michele said she finds volunteering for the ARB **personally rewarding**, but that it does require a monhtly time commitment. For **those considering volunteering** for a County Board, Authority or Commission (BAC), Michele stated that while this is not for everyone, she encourages those who have a deep interest in a particular BAC's purpose and goals, and who have the knowledge, skills and abilities required, to **pursue open opportunities**.

Michele lives with her husband, Peter Christensen, in the Oxford neighborhood of the District on land formerly **part of George and Martha Washington's Union Farm**. In her retirement, she has become a **history detective**, enjoying identifying family ancestors, learning who they were, what their lives were like, and why they migrated where they did.

Virtual Walking Tour of Stormwater Facilities

A new interactive map is available to **guide you along a walking tour** of stormwater management facilities located on the Fairfax County Government Center Campus. On the walking tour you will see **ponds**, **a native meadow**, **a restored stream**, **bioretention areas**, **swales**, **green roofs**, **and permeable pavers**. Learn how these facilities collect runoff to control flooding, encourage detention and infiltration, and improve water quality.

The next time you take a walk around the Government Center campus trails, open the new GIS app and **learn about the variety of stormwater management facilities** in use. Is Your House Ready for Winter?

The **LEAP weatherization program** is funded by Dominion Energy and eligibility is based upon age and income of residents. This program is **free to eligible Dominion Energy customers**. Single family homes, multi-family homes (apartments or condos) and mobile homes all qualify. **To help save on energy costs**, qualifying residents



will receive a free energy assessment and free energy-savings measures that may include:

Beech Bark Disease

Beech bark disease (BBD) is not established in Fairfax County but has been found nearby in Virginia and Pennsylvania. BBD is a devastating disease that affects native American Beech trees (Fagus grandifolia) as well as ornamental beech. It is caused by a sap feeding scale insect and a fungal pathogen. The insect, a small, white, fuzzy scale known as beech scale feeds on beech sap.

Heavy infestations may make the tree appear to have been **rolled in powdered sugar**. In later stages of the disease, large patches of bark may be **covered in small red dots** which are the fruiting structures of the pathogenic fungus (see photo). Read more...
