
### September 2018

- Starting construction soon: Belle View ES and Silverbrook ES
- Starting planning stages: West Potomac HS and Washington Mill ES

This represents 38% of the schools in the Mount Vernon District, and a **\$201 million County investment**! I am proud to have had a **key role** in getting these started and/or funded.

Having served our community as your school board member for 12 years prior to becoming your Supervisor, I am very pleased with the progress we have made in the last few years in our school system. I am particularly proud that we were able to fully fund the School Board's budget request this year to include increased pay and compensation packages for teachers and administrators. This increased funding will keep qualified teachers in our school system while encouraging others to join our mission, thereby reducing teacher vacancies. Parents make a difference every day by supporting their children, volunteering, helping with homework and establishing good relationships with educators. ## Wastewater Crews Demonstrate Commitment and Dedication to Residents

The next time you see a **Fairfax County truck** in your neighborhood, it may be one of the **Wastewater Closed Circuit Television** (CCTV crews) who are part of a **robust preventative maintenance program**. These crew members monitor the county's system of wastewater sewers by using specialized CCTV equipment. Their goal is to **inspect 200 miles** of pipe each year.



It's their job to **report problems** as soon they are found.

If they spot a problem, they immediately send a report to wastewater management using a computerized defect coding system and a **repair crew is dispatched** to the location.

CCTV crew members **frequently interact with residents** who are interested or have questions about what they are doing in their street. The crews take the time to **explain their work** and how they protect valuable county infrastructure and public health.


This is not where they stop. Each technician has **printed information** readily available that is given to a resident when crews see a concern in the system that may have an impact on the resident's sewer line. This level of effort shows residents that the County is working to **protect public health**, wastewater infrastructure and to help residents **prevent damage** to their property.

The **VDOT Richmond Highway Corridor Improvements team** is currently working to finalize major project design features, incorporating feedback from the public



information meetings held last year and earlier this year. The most recent developments include plans to move forward with **traditional intersection designs** at the intersections of Sacramento Drive/Cooper Road and Buckman Road/Mount Vernon Highway. The final design plans will be presented for **public comment at a public hearing early next year**. Read more...

### **Important Safety Messages**

### **Disasters Happen. Prepare Now. Learn How.**

National Preparedness Month, recognized each September, is a great reminder of how everyone needs to be prepared for the unexpected. National Preparedness Month will focus on planning, with an overarching theme: Disasters Happen. Prepare Now. Learn How. Throughout September, the Office of Emergency Management will help Fairfax County become ready and resilient. These steps will help guide you in making your emergency plan, making an emergency kit, getting important information and getting involved in your community.

- 1. **Make and Practice Your Plan** so your family knows what to do when an emergency or disaster strikes. Print out your plan and keep a copy in your emergency kits. Practice your plan by doing a family drill.
- 2. **Learn Life Saving Skills** such as ways to mitigate your home against disaster damage, how to shut off your utilities or even take a CPR or Stop the Bleed class in case you need to be the help, until help arrives.
- Check Your Insurance Coverage by calling your insurance company and asking
  for an insurance check-up to make sure you have enough coverage. Keep in mind,
  flood and earthquake insurance are separate policies and they take 30 takes to
  take effect.
- 4. **Save For an Emergency** and put all your important documents together in your go bag because once a disaster or emergency is over, it will help speed up the recovery process.
