Summer Meals for Kids



Approximately 29 percent of Fairfax County students receive free and reduced price meals during the school year. When the school year ends, so does the opportunity for consistent, nutritious meals for many of these students. The Free Summer Meals for Kids Program fills that need by providing nutritious meals to children ages 5 to 18 during the summer.

Locations in the Sully District:

- Rachel Carson Middle School V.I.P. Camp (13618 McLearen Road, Herndon, VA 20171); Program Dates: July 1 - August 1; Meal Service: Breakfast (8:30 to 9:00 a.m.) and Lunch (12:00 to 12:30 p.m.)
- Stone Middle School V.I.P. Camp (5500 Sully Park Drive, Centreville, VA 20120); Program Dates: July 1 August 1; Meal Service: Lunch (11:45 a.m. to 12:45 p.m.)

Both of these sites are designated as "closed sites." Closed sites are designated in areas where less than 50 percent of the students receive free or reduced price meals at school. **Meals will be provided to eligible children free of charge.** To be eligible to receive free meals at these locations, children must meet the <u>income guidelines for reduced price meals in the National School Lunch Program</u>. Children who are part of households that receive SNAP or Temporary Assistance to Needy Families (TANF) are automatically eligible to receive free meals. Location: Lake Braddock Secondary School (9200 Burke Lake Road, Burke, VA)


Volunteer to participate in Capital Fortitude, a full-scale emergency exercise designed to evaluate the National Capital Region's ability to dispense medication quickly in response to an anthrax attack. Although no actual medications will be handed out, public health staff and volunteers will go through the same procedures and protocols that they would use to dispense medications in a real disaster.

People of all ages, including parents with young children, people with disabilities, college students and faculty, scouts, community groups, seniors, members of faith-based communities, corporate employees, and the public are encouraged to <u>register in advance</u>. No special training is needed. Children under 16 should be accompanied by an adult. Participants should allow for two hours for the exercise.

PCA 2006-SU-025-04 (Regency Centers Acquisition, LLC) -

This application is to amend the proffers for RZ 2006-SU-025-03 previously approved for mixed use development to permit a drive-in financial institution and associated modifications to proffers and site design with an overall Floor Area Ratio (FAR) of 0.08 on the part of Land Bay D subject to this PCA (overall FAR of

Land Bay D is 0.41). Located in the N.E. corner of the northern intersection of Newbrook Drive and Westfields Boulevard on approximately 1.0 acres of land zoned PDC, WS, and AN. Staff recommends approval of PCA 2006-SU-025-04, subject to the execution of proffers consistent with those contained in Appendix 1. Staff recommends approval of FDPA 2006-SU-025-04, subject to the proposed development conditions contained in Appendix 2. To view the staff report, click here.

SE 2019-SU-007/SPA 81-C-027-03 (Brookfield Swimming Club Inc. and Pleasant Valley Preschool Inc.) -

This application proposes a child care center to operate at the existing swim club, primarily within the existing clubhouse facility and outdoor play area. The swim club is zoned to the R-3 District and is governed by special permit approval SPA 81--027-02. The applicant requests the following two approvals pursuant to this project:

- A special exception (SE) is requested pursuant to Sect. 9-309 of the Zoning Ordinance to permit a child care center to operate within the R-3 District.
- A special permit amendment (SPA) is requested pursuant to Sect. 8-401 of the Zoning Ordinance to amend the swim club approval (SPA 81-C-027-02) to modify development conditions to permit the child care center use to operate on-site pursuant to special exception approval.

The 2.89-acre subject property is located on the south side of Pennsboro Drive at its intersection with Ellendale Drive. The site is zoned to the R-3 District and Water Supply Protection Overlay District. Staff recommends approval of SE 2019-SU-007

and SPA 81-C-027-03 subject to the development conditions. To view the staff report, <u>click here</u>.

Autonomous Electric Shuttle Pilot in Fairfax County



Fairfax County and <u>Dominion Energy</u> are partnering on an autonomous electric shuttle pilot tentatively planned for the Merrifield area in Fairfax County. Today, the demonstration project moved a step closer to implementation with the award of a grant from the <u>Virginia Department of Rail and Public Transportation</u>(VDRPT) for the execution of the pilot. The <u>Virginia Commonwealth Transportation</u>

<u>Board</u> approved the \$250,000 grant for Fairfax County, making this pilot the first state-funded autonomous public transportation demonstration project in Virginia.

Fairfax County aims to be at the forefront of innovation by testing this smart technology for economic and environmental benefits, operational efficiencies, and as a first and last mile travel option connecting people from Metrorail stations to employment, activity centers, and residential communities.

Safety will be key to the successful implementation of the pilot and the project is

subject to safety reviews by the Virginia Department of Transportation (VDOT) and the <u>National Highway Traffic Safety Administration</u> (NHTSA). The shuttles will undergo extensive testing before passenger service can begin and a safety steward will be on board to monitor operations.

Documenting an ancestor at a certain place and time are the building blocks of genealogy research. Here are three steps to get you started on your family history research.

Step 1: Determining What You Know Already

Effective researchers begin with what they know and work backward in time toward the unknown. Reach out to family elders, friends, and neighbors to interview them about your ancestors.

Step 2: Start Organizing Your Material

To help you organize your material, go to Ancestry.com to access its <u>free forms</u>. The "Ancestral Chart" and "Family Group Sheet" will be most useful to a new genealogist.

Step 3: Start Your Research Online with Library Databases

Go to the <u>library web page</u> and navigate to "Research Center," then "A-Z Resources" for Heritage Quest. Ancestry Library is another great source, but you

must be in a library branch to access it.

Putting Plastic Pots in the Recycling Bin? Not so fast!

Plastic nursery pots are not recyclable in the single-stream recycling process used in Fairfax County. Products made with certain resins, those stamped with codes three through seven, are not easily or affordably recycled here.

Keep plastic pots and plant trays out of the recycling bin! What should you do with them? Here are some options:

- Reduce! Opt for bare-root plants or plants sold in biodegradable containers.
- **Reuse!** Reuse your plastic pots as much as possible. Reuse clean pots for starting seeds, sharing plant divisions, or storing garden gear.
- Recycle! Drop off nursery plastic at stores that promote its recycling. In our area, that includes Home Depot and Lowe's stores.
- Be alert to any other efforts to recycle plastic pots, such as <u>Virginia</u> Gardeners Recycle.
