A Message from Kathy Smith

The Board of Supervisors does not hold regular or committee meetings during the month of August. The next Board of Supervisors meeting will take place on Tuesday, September 15, 2020.

While the number of positive COVID-19 cases declined in Fairfax County, it is important to keep following guidelines to protect yourself and help slow the spread. Wear a face covering when in public places, maintain a space of six feet between yourself and others, and stay home when you can. Due to safety concerns about large public gatherings at this time, the 2020 Starlight Cinema events have been cancelled. Instead, the Fairfax County Park Authority will livestream 25 free summer concerts from now until August 30, 2020. More information about the virtual concerts is below.

The Virginia Department of Transportation (VDOT) is seeking public input on the Route 28 and Dulles Toll Road/Greenway Interchange study. The deadline for the online survey is August 2, 2020. More information about the project, and how to provide feedback, is below in the "Reminders" section.

2020 Census Takers to Begin Visiting Unreported Homes:

- The county has received responses from more than 76% of residents, but hopes to be near a 100% response rate before the final Census deadline. <u>Details</u>
- Enumerators (census takers) will be visiting households that have not yet responded to help collect Census information in a fast, safe, and confidential way. Residents in lowresponse areas may also receive emails asking them to complete the 2020 Census.
- If you respond online or by phone today, a census taker is less likely to have to visit your home to collect your response. Households can still complete the 2020 Census online, by phone at 844-330-2020 (TTY 711) or by completing the paper survey received in the mail. The Census Bureau does not disclose any personal information.

- Vaccines are still required to enroll into Fairfax County Public Schools (FCPS).

VDOT: Rt. 28 in Centreville Reduced to One Lane in Each Direction During Overnight Hours from August 3-6




Route 28 in Centreville will be reduced to a single travel lane in each direction for about one mile **during overnight hours Monday, August 3, through Thursday, August 6**, to accommodate installation of beams for the new Braddock Road/Walney Road Bridge. Twoway traffic will run on Route 28 North so that crews can safely install bridge beams over the southbound lanes of Route 28.

Other closures necessary during this time include: the ramps from Route 28 South to I-66 East and West, the ramp from I-66 East to Route 28 North, and Braddock Road near Route 28. Detours will be posted. Drivers should expect delays if traveling in this area.

Important reminders to keep yourself and others safe:



Be Aware of COVID-19 Contact Tracing Scams:

- Who are Contact Tracers? Contact tracers reach out to the contacts of sick individuals to let them know they may have been exposed to COVID-19 and provide guidance about taking care of yourself.
- Contact Tracing Scams: How to Identify Them
 - *Scammers may impersonate these government contact tracers and call or text people attempting to steal personal information.

*Look for these signs:

- Official Health Department contact tracers will never ask for your Social Security number, financial or banking information, passwords, or other personal information unrelated to COVID-19.
- Scammers may ask for cash, gift cards, wire transfers, or cryptocurrency.
- Scammers may also send text messages asking you to click a link.

Ways to Avoid Scams

- *Do not click links in emails or text messages. Instead, open a new window and search for the government agent or agency listed.
- *Say no to anyone asking cash, gift cards, financial and banking information, drivers licenses, etc.

- If you believe you have been the victim of a scam, call the Fairfax County Police Non-Emergency Line at 703-691-2131, TTY 711.

Tips for Cleaning & Disinfecting at Home During COVID-19:

- <u>Cleaning and disinfecting surfaces</u> is recommended by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), especially if you are living with someone who is ill or suspected to be ill.
- Follow the EPA's guidance on how to safely and effectively use disinfectants.
- High-touch surfaces, such as tables, doorknobs, light switches, handles, toilets and electronics should be regularly cleaned with a household cleaner and disinfected with an EPA-registered product.
