A Message from Kathy Smith

There is a significant increase in <u>daily reported COVID-19 cases</u> in the Fairfax Health District. The new cases reported for this week are: 400 on Monday, November 16; 196 on Tuesday, November 17; 254 on Wednesday, November 18; 207 on Thursday, November 19; and 261 today.

These past few months have been difficult, and I understand the desire to see our family and friends this holiday season, but it is important to fight COVID fatigue, and continue mask-wearing, social distancing, and staying home whenever possible. These are proven methods that will keep COVID-19 cases from increasing further in our community. The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) <u>does not recommend traveling for Thanksgiving</u>. The safest way to celebrate Thanksgiving is to celebrate at home with the people you live with.

If you are asked to quarantine, you should stay home for 14 days after your last close contact with a person who has COVID-19. **A negative test for COVID-19 during quarantine does not mean you can end quarantine early.** Fairfax County has many resources to help people safely isolate and quarantine and meet other basic needs. 

Five Things You Need to Know About COVID-19 Today:

- 1. COVID-19 cases continue to climb in our health district. We are now averaging more than 200 cases per day, more than any time since early June.
- 2. If you are identified as someone who has COVID-19 or have been exposed to someone who does, a Health Department staff member will contact you. It is important to answer the phone, listen to the voicemail, and/or return the call if asked to do so.
- 3. Fairfax County has many resources to help people safely isolate and quarantine and meet other basic needs.

- 4. Wearing a cloth face covering can protect you from COVID-19, not just others. The protective benefits of masks are stronger the more people wear masks consistently and correctly, the CDC says.

VDOT: New Ramp from Route 28 North to I-66 East Opening to Traffic Beginning on or about Friday, November 20:

- **UPDATE:** Ramp closure hours have been expanded -- Route 29 South to Route 28 North will close from 10 p.m. until 4: 30 a.m.; Route 28 North to I-66 East will close from 11 p.m. to 4 a.m.
- A new, permanent ramp from Route 28 North to I-66 East will open on or about Friday morning, November 20. Drivers on Route 28 North will stay to the right to access I-66 East using the new ramp. <u>Details</u>
- Opening the new ramp will end use of the current, temporary ramp accessed from the left-most lanes of northbound Route 28. The temporary detour for Route 29 (Lee Highway) South drivers heading to I-66 East will also be lifted.
- Drivers should always use caution and pay attention to lane markings and roadway signs in construction work zones. All work is weather dependent and will be rescheduled if inclement conditions occur.



CECAP Process Update

Since its inception, development of the Community-wide Energy and Climate Action Plan (CECAP) has been driven by the county's interest in having community representatives bring their expertise, experience, and perspective to discussions about goal-setting and greenhouse gas mitigation strategies.

The COVID-19 pandemic required the planning process to move online. This unexpected change introduced new challenges to the development of the CECAP and led county staff and the CECAP consultants to reimagine the planning process.

As of October 24, the CECAP Focus Groups and Task Force were merged into a single, new group – the CECAP Working Group. In this new model, all members have an identical role and can participate in discussion and decision making.
