A Message from Kathy Smith

Sending my warmest wishes to everyone celebrating Hanukkah! Chag Sameach!

Yesterday, Governor Ralph Northam <u>announced new measures to slow the spread of COVID-19</u> as new cases and hospitalizations continue to rise in Virginia. Executive Order Seventy-Two directs Virginians to stay at home between the hours of 12:00 a.m. and 5:00 a.m., implements a universal mask requirement, and lowers the limit on social gatherings from 25 people to 10 people. The order will take effect at 12:01 a.m. on Monday, December 14, 2020 and remain in place through January 31, 2021, unless rescinded or amended.

The COVID-19 vaccine situation is changing day-to-day. Here is what we currently know. To trigger an immune response, many vaccines put a weakened or inactivated germ into our bodies. Not mRNA vaccines. Instead, mRNA vaccines teach our cells how to make a protein—or even just a piece of a protein—that triggers an immune response inside our bodies. That immune response, which produces antibodies, is what protects us from getting infected if the real virus enters our bodies. Take a closer look at how COVID-19 mRNA Vaccines work.

We are still waiting to learn if the FDA will approve Emergency Use Authorization for the Pfizer and Moderna mRNA vaccines. If approved, an estimated 50 million doses would be distributed by Pfizer, and an estimated 15 million doses would be distributed by Moderna by the end of 2020.

With the distribution of a vaccine on the the horizon, it is still important to continue practicing COVID guidelines set by the Centers for Disease Control (CDC). There were 323 new cases of COVID-19 reported today in Fairfax County.

It is likely that the CDC will prioritize healthcare workers and the elderly to receive the vaccine first because of their high risk. The New York Times created a <u>tool to help you estimate your place in the vaccine line</u>.

So be sure to wear a mask when in public or when around people who don't live in your household, clean your hands and frequently touched surfaces often, and <u>quarantine or isolate</u> if you or a close contact has been exposed. More information is below in the "Coronavirus Column."



Important reminders to keep yourself and others safe:



Fairfax County Health Department's COVID-19 Vaccine Overview:

- The Health Department will work on vaccine distribution plans when a
 vaccine receives emergency use authorization. The FDA's scientific
 review and consideration by the Vaccine and Related Biologic Products
 Advisory Committee (VRBPAC) took place on December 10, 2020 for
 Pfizer and will take place on December 17, 2020 for Moderna.
- The vaccine will require two doses and the interval between the first and second dose will likely be in the 21-28 day range.

<u>VDOT - Route 29 in Centreville Reduced to Two Lanes Under I-66 for Continued Bridge Demolition This Weekend December 11-14:</u>

Demolition of overhead I-66 bridges will require Route 29 (Lee Highway) in Centreville to be reduced to a single lane in each direction between 9 p.m. Friday, December 11, and 5:00 a.m. Monday, December 14. Two-way traffic will run on Route 29 South during this period. <u>Details</u>

New Ramp from I-66 to Braddock Road/Walney Road Overpass Opening to Traffic on or About Wednesday, December 16:

- The new, permanent ramp from I-66 West to the new Braddock Road/Walney Road overpass over Route 28 will open on or about Wednesday, December 16. Drivers on westbound I-66 traveling to Braddock Road and Walney Road will take the exit for Route 28 North, then stay to the left to access the new ramp to Braddock Road and Walney Road. Details
- Drivers should always use caution and pay attention to lane markings and roadway signs in construction zones. All work is weather dependent and will be rescheduled if inclement conditions occur.

Dulles Toll Road Goes Cashless:

- In response to customers' preference for electronic toll payments, the Dulles Toll Road will be going permanently cashless on January 1, 2021.
- In addition, loose change will no longer be accepted and tollbooth change baskets will be removed.
